

OUR HISTORY

On March 21, 1999, River Oaks Community Church held its first worship service at Forsyth County Day School. From the very beginning, we wanted to create a new kind of church—a church people of all ages would love to attend and a place where those with spiritual questions would feel welcome. Our worship team played contemporary music and we encouraged people to “come as you are.”



As the Lord blessed this endeavor, the church grew from thirty families to a vibrant congregation in need of a permanent home. Through events that can only be attributed to the Lord's provision, twenty-five acres of strategic real estate were purchased on Lewisville-Clemmons Road and, in 2004, 174 families pledged \$2.25 million dollars for the construction of our current facility.



GOD AT WORK

Reflecting on the past nineteen years, it is exciting to see how God has been at work in us and through us. As we have proclaimed the hope and life found in our Savior, Jesus Christ, we have seen God faithfully change lives. 

DISCIPLESHIP CENTER

Our current infrastructure is inadequate to accommodate the number of groups that gather throughout the week to study God's Word. We are at maximum capacity, with groups meeting in storage areas, common areas, and preschool classrooms. The Discipleship Center will advance our mission by providing much-needed small group meeting space for adults and students, allowing twelve groups to meet simultaneously on the second floor. A large, open area on the first floor will provide a permanent meeting space for group meetings like MOMS, Run for God, leader training, equipping classes, dinners, community forums, and additional Sunday morning space for biblical equipping. This building would also provide additional office space and storage.

SANCTUARY EXPANSION

We always want to be prepared to welcome the next person God brings into His kingdom. Once the Discipleship Center is complete, the sanctuary will be expanded by removing the walls that separate it from our classrooms. Our staff has received feedback that it can be difficult to find a seat on Sunday mornings, especially for groups of three or more who enter while the congregation is standing in worship. The expansion will provide additional seating and improve accessibility to those seats, allowing us to say, "Come as you are; there is a place for you." The removal of the "white house" will also allow for additional paved parking on the north side of the church. The gravel lot in front of the Noah's Ark entrance will be converted to paved parking, improving accessibility for families with young children.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY EXPANSION



We are Next-Gen focused.

Central to our 2025 Vision is our commitment to reaching the next generation. From day one, our ministry to children and students has been a priority, and this calling has only intensified. While nothing can replace the importance of friendly faces and warm hospitality, we know that spaces are important too. Those who enter through the Noah's Ark entrance walk across a gravel parking lot and enter into a relatively narrow space, with a traffic flow that discourages fellowship. We know from interviews that many families enter and exit through this entrance without ever visiting the Coffee Bar.

Enlarging this entrance will allow space for an indoor play structure while providing an area for parents to connect. A parent-functional, kid-friendly entrance to this important area of the church will significantly help younger families connect to the life of our congregation.

COFFEE BAR REMODEL

The Coffee Bar area will be renovated to allow for more casual gatherings and informal meetings. Because of the high importance we place on being relationally connected, our spaces should be conducive to fellowship throughout the week. More seats will be added in order to allow people to simply “sit and talk.” We’re hopeful this area will also be utilized during the week by those who work from home and in the afternoon by students looking for a place to study.

BEYOND OUR WALLS

Since our inception, our church has been mission minded. The very first check we wrote was to missions. We recognize the great need in many parts of the world, the tremendous ways in which we have been blessed with resources, and the opportunities we have been given to participate in building the kingdom of God locally and globally. A team is evaluating opportunities for how 10% of funds, as received, will be strategically invested “beyond our walls,” in keeping with our DNA. Thus, our financial goal factors in that 90% of pledges received will go toward construction and 10% toward these outreach projects.

FAQ

What is the purpose of *Beyond*?

Beyond has a financial purpose and a spiritual purpose. Financially, we intend to raise the capital necessary to fuel the vision we feel the Lord has given us. Spiritually, we are embarking on a faith-building journey. The result of this journey cannot be measured in dollars, but in the hearts of people who are experiencing the joy of yielding more and more of their lives to the lordship of Jesus Christ.

Does the church have a target amount?

Our target amount is \$4.25 million dollars. This amount is reflective of the initial estimates associated with pursuing our vision while allowing for 10% of pledges received to be invested in “beyond-our-walls” projects.

Is the target amount the same as the total project cost?

We anticipate a small variance between our target amount and our total project cost. The reason is twofold. First, when the initial plans were shared with small group leaders and ministry team leaders this past spring, we received consistent feedback—one item was missing. That was a covered vehicle entrance that would benefit those requiring extra time or assistance during inclement weather. Second, since we received the initial estimates from our builder, building material increases and tariff negotiations have resulted in rising construction costs. As result, it is impossible to finalize costs at this stage. We predict actual costs will differ from our target amount by less than a half million dollars. While we would prefer not to take on new debt, we feel this amount is manageable if necessary.

Should I reduce my regular giving to give to this initiative?

Please do not. As we go through this campaign and building cycle, our ministries will continue to operate and—likely—expand; we need your regular support to remain vibrant. Pray about making a sacrificial pledge above your regular giving over a three-year period.

What happens if we exceed or fall short of our financial goal?

The elders will take time to pray and discern how to invest any surplus or adjust the scope or timing of the project for any shortfall.

Why invest in bricks and mortar when the missions needs of the world are so great?

We believe an investment in this building project is an investment in missions! In fact, we envision a multiplication of missions work both locally and internationally as a result of our strategic investment in discipleship and teaching environments. The heartbeat of our 2025 Vision expresses our desire to see dramatic growth in both missions funding and missions engagement by our members in the next few years. We see our expansion as a means to further the work of God's kingdom here and around the world.

When would construction begin and how long will it take?

Construction is targeted to begin in January 2019 and conclude in the fall of 2019.

Will any other work be done outside the projects mentioned above?

Yes. Our church has been disciplined in setting aside funds for future maintenance needs for many years. Because of the savings associated with performing these repairs or replacements concurrent with the major project, we will do so. As an example, our parking lot suffers from substantial cracking and is in need of resurfacing. Much of our carpet has also exceeded its lifespan. The costs associated with these maintenance-related repairs or replacements are not factored into the campaign project and will be funded from by our church's facility fund.

What should I give?

Good question! That's between you and God. The amount should represent something that is a heartfelt, spiritual decision—not simply an afterthought or an obligation. Scripture challenges us to give first to God's work, and to do so with passion and joy. In Luke 21, Christ commended a widow for her offering of only two copper coins. We will not give equally, but we can sacrifice equally. If we each pray about—and then give—an offering that represents true sacrifice, the cumulative effort will be amazing.

What if I cannot give a sacrificial gift because of my current circumstances?

Then give what you have: enthusiasm, influence, hope, prayer. Pray for your leaders, pastors, volunteers, members, and for this campaign. In short, do what you can with what you have. God knows our circumstances, so He knows what faithfulness looks like for each one of us.

When do I need to make this commitment?

Commitment Sunday will be November 4, 2018. Every household in the church will be given the opportunity to participate. The contribution time frame for the commitment is three years. You can fulfill your pledge all at once or pay it weekly, monthly, quarterly, or annually. Some will utilize the tax advantage of giving a gift this year (2018) and in 2019, 2020, and 2021, allowing the pledge to be spread over four tax years.

OUR ASK

1 PRAY FOR THE FUTURE OF RIVER OAKS AS WE PURSUE THE VISION GOD HAS GIVEN US.

- **320 Prayer:** Pray Ephesians 3:20 for our church every day at 3:20pm. “God, we pray you would do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think—in our lives and in our church—and that you would receive the glory.”
- **Group Prayer:** During the forty days leading up to November 4, pick one hour, on one day, when you can join with others in the prayer room. More details to follow.
- **Personal Prayer:** Pray specifically about how God would want you to give to this vision.
