





Exodus 12:1-2

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, "This month shall be for you the beginning of months. It shall be the first month of the year for you."


The first Jewish calendar for holidays Months by the moon, the year by the sun **Rosh Hodesh is** the new moon



Month names are Akkadian from captivity in Babylonian **Only four prior** in Scriptures: Aviv (1), Ziv (2), Ethanim (7), Bul (8)



1st c. civil affairs calendar began with Tishri (7) 12 months, with 29 or 30 days Every 3rd year is a leap year (2022 – Adar II)


