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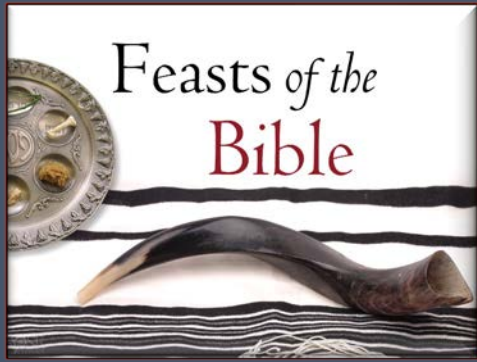
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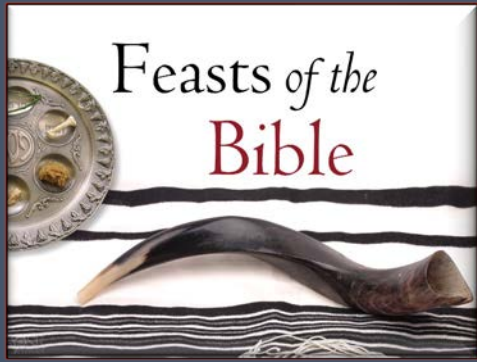
Feasts of the Bible

High-level introduction to the feasts and holidays of the Old Testament which unveil God's redemptive plan and serve as a shadow of the things to come, the substance found in Christ.

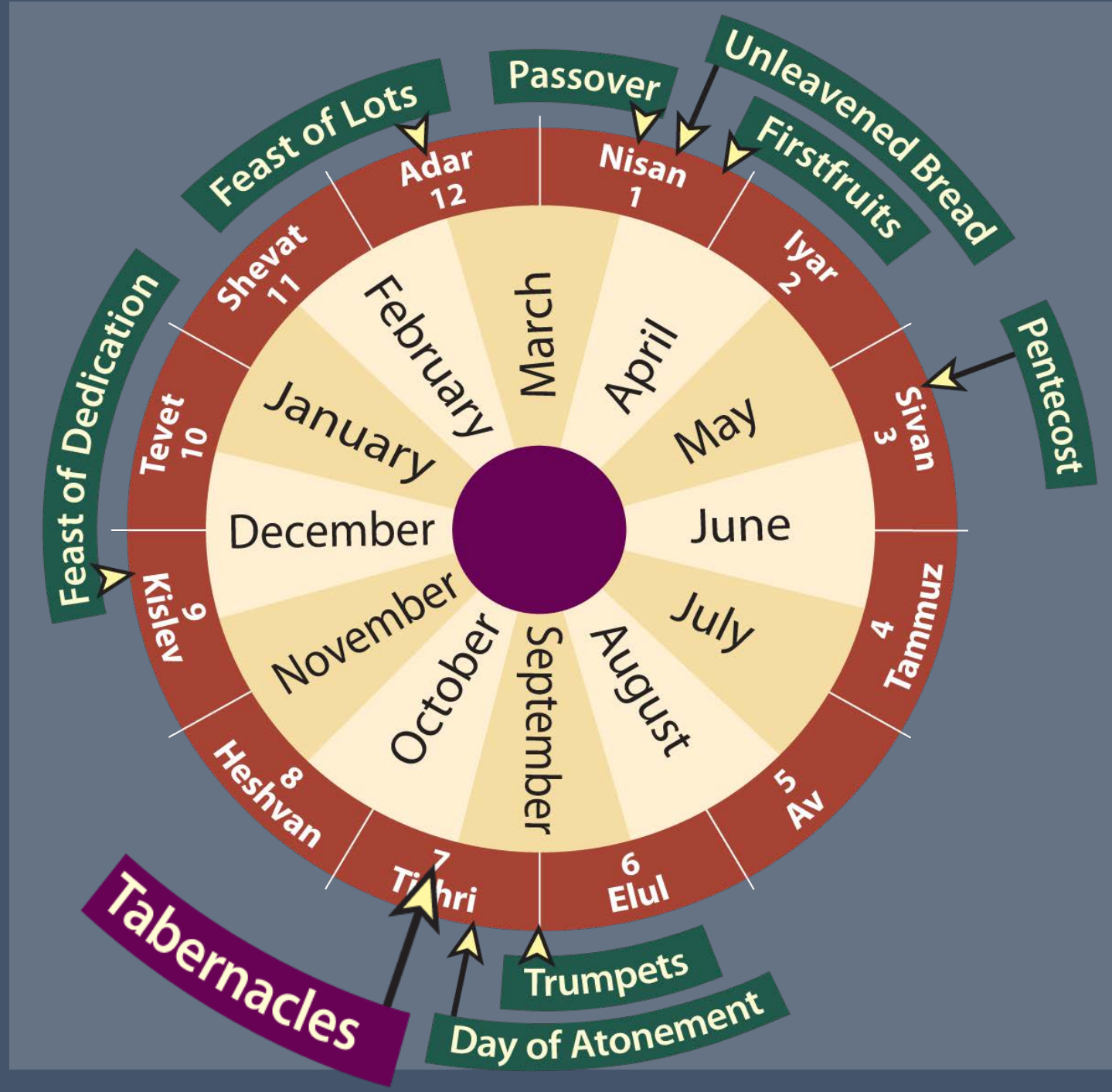

- Feast of Sukkot (Booths / Huts)
- Observed on 15-22 Tishri
- Lev. 23:33-43





Leviticus 23:33-43

And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, “Speak to the people of Israel, saying, On the fifteenth day of this seventh month and for seven days is the Feast of Booths to the LORD. On the first day shall be a holy convocation; you shall not do any ordinary work. For seven days you shall present food offerings to the LORD. On the

eight day you shall hold a holy convocation and present a food offering to the LORD. It is a solemn assembly; you shall not do any ordinary work. “These are the appointed feasts of the LORD, which you shall proclaim as times of holy convocation, for presenting to the Lord food offerings, burnt offerings and grain

offerings, sacrifices and drink offerings, each on its proper day, besides the LORD's Sabbaths and besides your gifts and besides all your vow offerings and besides all your freewill offerings, which you give to the LORD. "On the fifteenth day of the seventh month, when you have gathered in the produce of the land,



Leviticus 23:33-43

you shall celebrate the feast of the Lord seven days. On the first day shall be a solemn rest, and on the eighth day shall be a solemn rest. And you shall take on the first day the fruit of splendid trees, branches of palm trees and boughs of leafy trees and willows of the brook, and you shall rejoice before the Lord, the Lord



Leviticus 23:33-43

your God seven days. You shall celebrate it as a feast to the LORD for seven days in the year. It is a statute forever throughout your generations; you shall celebrate it in the seventh month. You shall dwell in booths for seven days. All native Israelites shall dwell in booths, that generations may know that I made the people of Israel



Leviticus 23:33-43

dwell in booths when I brought them out of the land of Egypt: I am the LORD your God.”

The Sukkah

- Temporary Structure of Wood and Canvas
- Plant Coverings: Myrtle, Citron, Palm, & Willow
- Talmud Laws to Sukkah









The Sukkah

- Decorated with Autumn
- Today, Often 1 Daily Meal
- Waving the Lulav Daily as God's Presence





Tabernacles

- Ceremonies of Water
 - Water from Pool of Siloam to Temple
 - Isaiah 11:9 - Knowledge of the Lord as waters ...



Tabernacles

- Ceremonies of Light
 - Golden Lamps in Temple
 - Courtyard Lit By Torch
- Messiah Will Be a Light to All Nations

“Then everyone who survives of all the nations shall go up to worship the King, the Lord of hosts, and keep the Feast of Booths.” - Zechariah 14:16

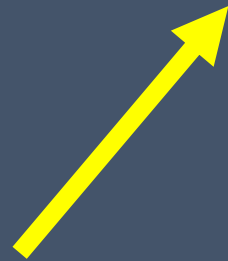

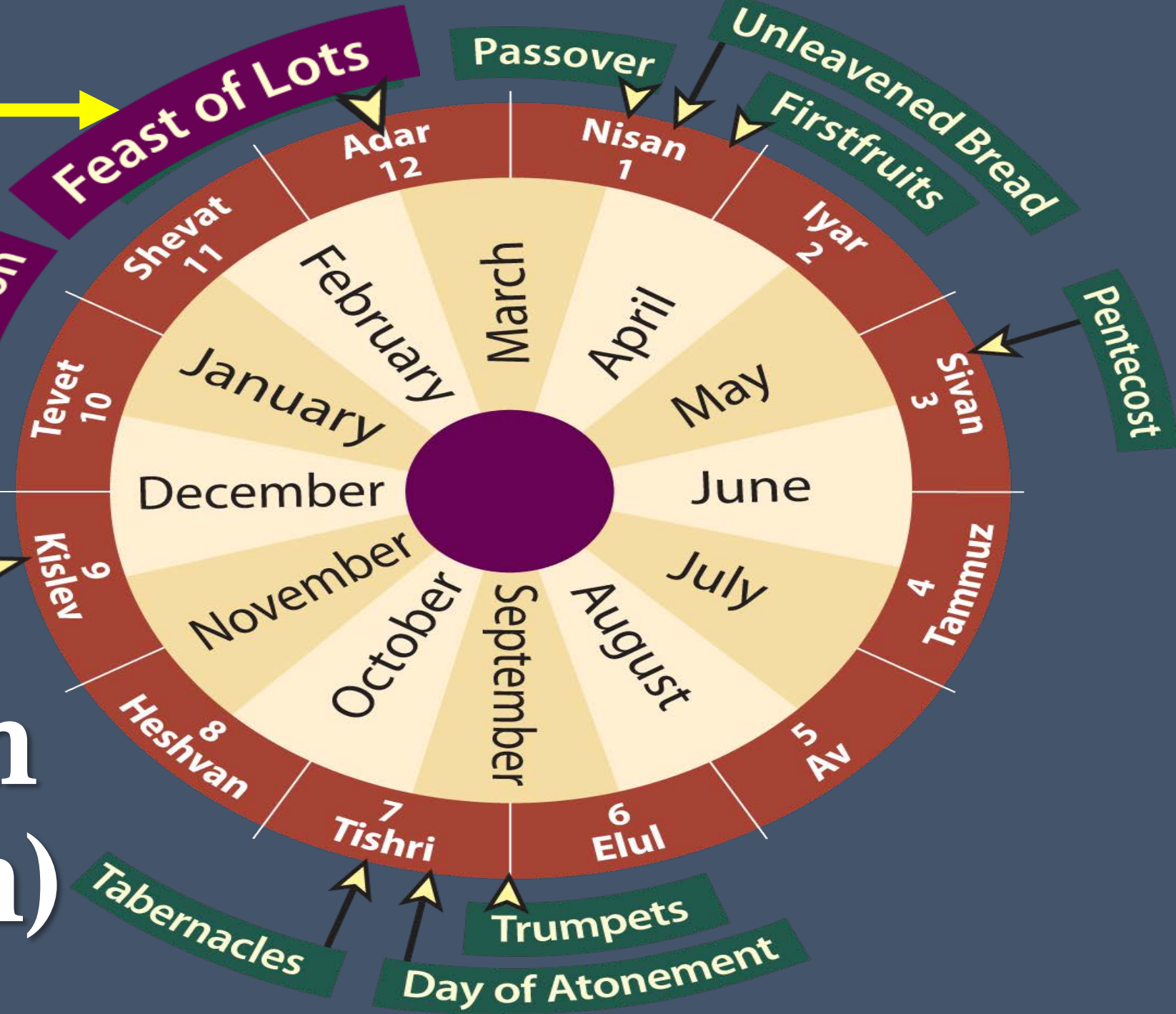

Dedication

- The History
 - Seleucid (Greek) King Epiphanes defiles Temple
 - Judas Maccabeus leads revolt and restore Temple

- Book of Esther



Esther 3:6-7

Haman sought to destroy all the Jews, the people of Mordecai, throughout the whole kingdom of Ahasuerus. In the first month, which is the month of Nisan, in the twelfth year of King Ahasuerus, they cast **Pur** (that is, they cast lots) before Haman day after day; and they cast it month after month till the twelfth month, which is the month of Adar.



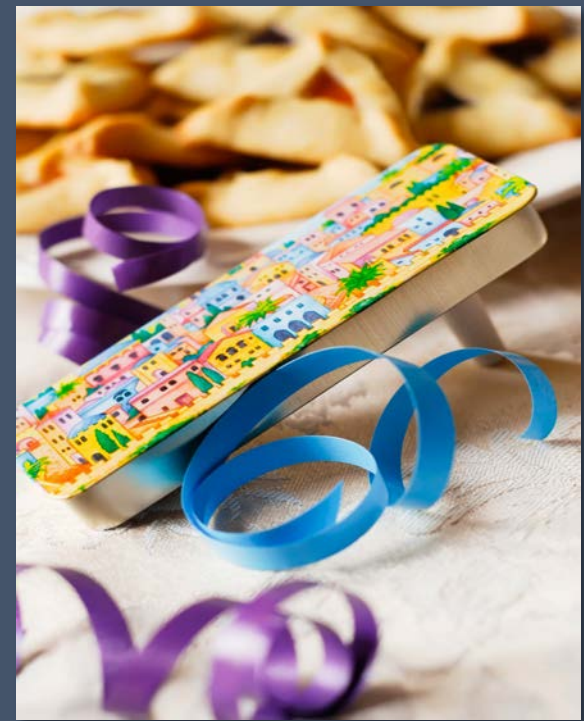
